Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) for Opiate Addiction

Though not a cure, Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) has been identified as the most effective method of treatment for adults struggling with opiate addiction.

When combined with behavioral therapy, medical care and support groups, Medication Assisted Treatment offers the best chance for long-term recovery from heroin or other opiates by reducing the occurrence of relapse.

Methadone and Suboxone® are synthetic narcotics used legally as both a pain medication and a blocking agent for the effects of heroin and other opiates, including Oxycontin®. When prescribed to treat opiate addiction, methadone and Suboxone® suppresses withdrawal symptoms for 24 - 36 hours and individuals experience neither the cravings for opiates or the euphoric rush typically associated with them.

Methadone or Suboxone?

Our knowledgeable assessment team can help determine if methadone or Suboxone® is best for an individual based on responses to the questions below.

- » Is the individual addicted to heroin or other opiates?
- » Has the individual unsuccessfully attempted other treatment methods and failed?

Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) Outcomes

MAT is a proven, effective option for many individuals recovering from opiate addiction. It offers individuals a reprieve from the physical symptoms of addiction and an opportunity to focus on the support programs and ongoing counseling crucial to recovery.

Clients meet with a nurse and/or physician to take a prescribed dose of methadone or Suboxone® and a counselor to address their individualized addiction, recovery, and medical challenges and goals.

Referrals to an intensive outpatient program and self-help groups inclusive of Narcotics Anonymous and/or Alcoholics Anonymous are provided for clients who need additional recovery support.

Participation in random, mandatory urine screens under supervision to confirm the client's substance-free status is required.
